  - A. Rank industries by (aggregate) injury data from multiple sources, **assigning greater weight to state BLS data than to federal BLS data**
  - B. Group industries into four categories by those rankings
  - C. Using random lists (excluding only those places of employment subject to a comprehensive inspection in previous 3 years), inspect 30 percent of places of employment in first group, 10 percent in second group, 5 percent in third group, **and a very small sample of fourth group.**
  - D. Question: Should fourth (lowest) group be subject to very infrequent random inspection?  
**GROUP CONSENSUS: YES, no group should be completely excluded**
  - E. Question: Is 3 years the right exclusion for “recency”?
  - F. Question: Should inspection results affect scheduling (either to leave an employer on the list because of violations or to exclude an employer because of “in compliance” inspections)?  
**GROUP CONSENSUS: YES, there should be some effect (no details discussed)**
  - G. Question: Should other factors be used to trigger programmed inspections?
  - H. Question: Other issues?
